Proclamation

- WHEREAS, *the safety of the buildings we occupy daily is essential to the health, safety and welfare of the residents of Illinois; and*
- WHEREAS, *among the world's most fundamental laws are those which provide safety standards for the construction of buildings in which people live, work, play and learn; and*
- WHEREAS, *for construction and building codes to be effective and enforced, understanding and cooperation must exist between code officials and the people they serve; and*
- WHEREAS, *building safety and fire prevention officials, architects, engineers, builders and others in the construction industry work year-round to ensure the safe construction of buildings; and*
- WHEREAS, *countless lives have been saved because of the building safety codes adopted and enforced by local and state agencies; and*
- WHEREAS, *Building Safety Month, sponsored by the International Code Council and the International Code Council Foundation, is an excellent opportunity to educate the public; and*
- WHEREAS, *the observance of Building Safety Month is a perfect time to increase public awareness of the role building safety and fire prevention officials, local building departments, state and federal agencies play in protecting lives and property; and*
- WHEREAS, *this year's theme, "Commemorating a 30-Year Legacy of Leadership," encourages all Illinois residents to raise public awareness of building and fire safety; and*
- WHEREAS, *everyone can take appropriate steps to ensure that the places where we live, work, play and learn are safe; and*
- WHEREAS, *this year, during the observation of Building Safety Month, all Illinois residents are encouraged to consider projects to improve building safety at home and in the community, and to recognize local building safety and fire prevention officials and the important role that they play in public safety;*

THEREFORE, I, Pat Quinn, Governor of the State of Illinois, do hereby proclaim May 2010 as **BUILDING SAFETY MONTH** in Illinois, and encourage all citizens to recognize the importance of improving building safety in this state and to participate in activities and efforts planned for this month to improve building safety.
